Avoid touching eyes, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands

COVID-19

COVID-19 is a new illness that can affect your lungs and airways. It's caused by a virus called coronavirus.

Symptoms of coronavirus

It can take up to 14 days for symptoms of coronavirus to appear. They can be similar to the symptoms of cold and flu. Common symptoms of coronavirus include:

- a fever (high temperature -38 degrees Celsius or above)
- a cough this can be any kind of cough, not just dry
- shortness of breath or breathing difficulties
